Witt, Ina Haynes, 94, of Big Stone Gap, VA, went to be with her lord on Wednesday June 8, 2011.

She was born in Coley Creek, Kentucky on January 28, 1917 to Ethel Pendleton Haynes and Caleb Haynes. She was the oldest of three children.

She moved from Kentucky to Appalachia, Va. and later to the cadet area when she was 9 years old. She lived the remainder of her life in the Big Stone Gap area.
