Larry Edwin Dickenson, age 68, of the Cracker's Neck Community of Big Stone Gap, Virginia passed away on July 20, 2014.

Larry was a graduate of Powell Valley High School and attended Clinch Valley College at Wise, VA. He was employed at Westmoreland Coal Company for several years and was the Manager of Personnel and Worker's Compensation. He then became employed at Holston Valley Hospital and Medical Center as Director of Occupational Medicine. His last employment was with HCMF Corporation of Roanoke, VA where he served as Director of Worker's Compensation for all the Heritage Hall Nursing Homes in the state of Virginia.

Larry was a member of the Stonega Veteran's Association. He served as pianist for several churches in the area over the years and remained a member of the Cedar Ridge FWB Church in Cracker's Neck. He was also pianist for The Wilson Trio of Big Stone Gap for many years.

Larry was preceded in death by his loving parents, Herman E. and Ruby Dickenson of Cracker's Neck, VA. His maternal grandparents, Kier and Lillie Shoop of Cracker's Neck, VA and paternal grandparents, George and Cornie Dickenson of Cracker's Neck, Va. 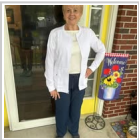
