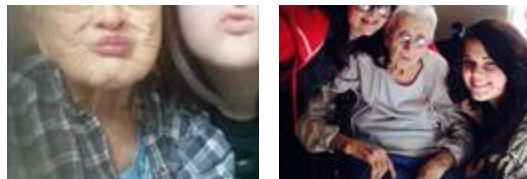
“ *Dear Margaret and Barbara,
