“ *I am very sorry for your loss. You don't know me but I will tell you I met William while serving in Vietnam in 1969 or 1970 at a little outpost called Nui Kim, just north of Camp Carroll, 5 miles below the DMZ. There were two small groups of Americans there, a flash unit and a radar unit. William served in the flash unit and I was in the radar unit. While playing cards one night together, William asked where I was from and I told him "Virginia". He asked "where bouts" and I said "Norton." Next question was usually , what's that close to, but he replied, "Hell, I'm from Appalachia." I will never forget that, we were thousands of miles from home and we lived only 10 miles apart. Again, I am sorry for your loss. May he rest in peace.*
